## Prayer Walk

A massive “thank you” to everyone who helped plan, helped run and participated so enthusiastically on our prayer walk on Wednesday afternoon – I had a great time! One of the activities included planting a hyacinth bulb which, if treated well, should flower in the depths of winter – maybe even in time for Christmas, and be a reminder of the warmth and colours of summer and autumn. So here are some tip on how to treat it well...

The tip of the bulb should be above the top of the soil. Keep moist but do not over water. Place in a cool, but frost free, place at a maximum of 9OC. Check weekly. After 10-12 weeks, when the flower bud is through the neck of the bulb, bring into a warm, light room at approx. 18°C.



And finally, a massive “thank you” to Lunesdale Home and Gardens in Kirkby Lonsdale who ordered the bulbs for us and then donated them without even being asked!!
