

# Autumn Term 2018 Class 1

## Maths

### Number and Shape, Space, Measures:

**Reception:** To count objects to 10 and begin to count beyond; select the correct numeral to represent 1 to 5, then 1 to 10 objects; estimate how many objects they can see and then check by counting them; recognising 1 more or 1 less; begin to recognise 2D and 3D shapes; order 2 or 3 items by length, height, weight and capacity.

**Y1:** Count numbers to 50, forwards and backwards; read and write numbers 1 to 20 in numerals and words; identify 1 more and 1 less than a given number; measure and begin to record height, length, weight; solve simple addition and subtraction problems; recognise and name 2D and 3D shapes.

## Literacy and Language

**Literacy:** In this term's topics we will be reading the story 'A Year in Percy's Park' and looking at the different seasons. We will be looking at different types of transport in fiction and non-fiction books. Looking at old and new types of transport over the years.

**Phonics:** Read/Write sessions will take place each day for forty minutes.



## All Roads Lead To Rome

**Hook:** The children will be visiting Leighton Moss bird reserve to take part in an educational workshop.



## Peace

Through collective worship and RE, the children will be exploring the Christian value of Peace or Shalom.

It explores the need for peace and tranquillity in life as a time for thoughtfulness, calmness and as a time for reflection.

**Science:** The children will be learning about seasonal changes. They will be observing and describing weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.

### Design/Technology:

The children will be looking at what a moving vehicle is. They will be identifying the main parts; designing and making their own moving vehicle and evaluating it.

**Computing:** The children will be developing their keyboard skills through accessing the class computers.

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## The Arts

**Music:** The children will use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes in singing each week.

**Art:** The children will experiment, invent and create their own works of art, craft and design using colour, pattern and texture. The children will use drawing and painting to share their ideas, experiences and imagination.

**Drama:** This term the children will be performing in our annual Christmas play.

## Humanities

**Religious Education:** The children will be exploring the idea of peace. They will have the opportunity to consider what it is like to have still, quiet moments. They will also be learning how peace can be making new friends, saying sorry when you hurt someone or being kind to people. The children will also be listening to stories about Jesus, such as when he calmed the storm.

**History:** In our topic the children will be developing an awareness of the past through finding out about the history of transport. They will be identifying similarities and differences between ways of life in different periods and the different modes of transport in time.

## Health and Wellbeing

### Personal, Social and Emotional Learning: New Beginnings

This theme focuses on developing children's knowledge, understanding and skills in four key social and emotional aspects of learning: empathy, self-awareness, social skills and motivation. The children will have a number of opportunities to appreciate and celebrate differences and to understand how it feels, and how important it is, to belong to a group. They will consider how everybody can be helped to feel safe and happy in the setting and to understand the routines and expectations there.

**Physical Education:** Each week the children will have a lesson of PE when they will be developing skills such as running, throwing, catching, jumping and balancing. It is important for young children to have regular exercise to develop their gross motor skills, so they will also take part in short activities using the SMART moves programme and yoga.
