

Autumn Term 2018 Class 2

Maths

Number: Place value, counting and sorting, number bonds, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division strategies, problem solving involving money

Shape, Space, Measures: Properties of 2D and 3D shapes, time, statistics and length and perimeter

Literacy and Language

Literacy: The Mousehole Cat

The children will explore this story and how effective and descriptive language is used. They will explore characters and write descriptions.

They will develop vocabulary to use in writing, such as describing settings, poetry, story mapping and story writing and how to vary sentence structure.

They will plan writing and develop independent writing skills including planning, composing, editing and improving work. They will follow grammar, language, spelling or phonics programmes differentiated according to their needs.

Language- French : Children in Y3 will be starting to learn to speak French. They will be learning to say hello and goodbye; introduce themselves; say how they are feeling and to count to 10.



All Roads Lead To Rome

Hook: We will be visiting the Roman Museum at Ribchester



Peace

Through collective worship and RE, the children will be exploring the Christian value of Peace or Shalom.

It explores the need for peace and tranquillity in life as a time for thoughtfulness, calmness and as a time for reflection.

Science and Technology

Science: Forces and Magnets

The children will identify forces acting on objects and investigate the effects of friction on different surfaces. They will sort magnetic and non-magnetic materials and investigate the strength of different magnets. They will explore magnetic poles and how poles attract and repel each other and which materials are attracted to a magnet.

Design/Technology: The children will plan, design and make a Roman purse and then evaluate their finished product.

Computing: The children will be learning to develop word processing skills including editing; undo/redo; select and format; using folders; adding and formatting an image. Some children will further develop their skills by learning to take screenshots, use bullets and numbering and text boxes.

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The Arts

Music: In singing lessons, the children will use their voices expressively and creatively with increasing accuracy, control and expression. They will also have the opportunity to play percussion instruments.

Art: After our trip to Ribchester the children will design and make a Roman shield and evaluate the finished product. They will also make a Roman artefact, for example a pot or coin from clay using research to plan their design.

Drama: Through our book, we will explore role play and improvised drama showing understanding of characters, reading aloud with expression, story mapping and oral retelling of stories and hot seating of characters.

Humanities

Religious Education: In RE the children will be exploring the Christian idea of peace. This includes harmony between people, harmony between people and God, and harmony between humans and the whole of creation. We will explore how Christians put their faith into action by helping others, including the work of the Salvation Army.

Geography: The children will identify Italy and its major cities on a map and explore geographical features. They will explore some of the tourist attractions of Rome. They will investigate the similarities and differences between Italy and the UK.

History: The children will explore the story of Romulus and Remus and how Rome was founded. They will explore how society was structured in Rome and what daily life was like for Ancient Romans. They will discover what Ancient Romans did for entertainment and about their beliefs in different gods and goddesses.

Health and Wellbeing

Personal, Social and Emotional Learning:

Our theme of 'New Beginnings' focuses on developing children's knowledge, understanding and skills in four key social and emotional aspects of learning: empathy, self-awareness, social skills and motivation.

Physical Education:

Y2 children will continue to take part in the SMART moves programme to develop their gross motor skills further. Y3 children will begin their yearly swimming lessons this term. All of Class 2 will be develop a broader range of skills and the opportunity for some fun, competitive sport through weekly football coaching sessions.
